### *HBIF President Augusto Sanabria to Attend Florida Business Leaders' Briefing*

**ORLANDO, FL (March 15, 2012)** - Business leaders from the Orlando, Tampa and Jacksonville areas will be participating in a briefing with Senior Administration Officials at the White House on Mar. 19 at 2 p.m. Augusto Sanabria, President of the Hispanic Business Initiative Fund of Florida, will be attending Monday's Florida Business Leaders' Briefing at the White House in representation of Hispanic entrepreneurs from the State of Florida.

"I am honored to have been invited to represent our business community and, in particular, Hispanic entrepreneurs," said Augusto Sanabria. "This is a great opportunity for our business leaders to provide direct input to policymakers. In the first half of 2012, Business Forward is supporting a series of fly-ins and forums that will bring more than 2,000 business leaders from across the country to share their ideas with White House officials.
